Another year in the history of Santa Fe and the Historic Santa Fe Foundation. A year not without its challenges, but certainly not without numerous rewards. I find it difficult to look back when we are focused forward, so rather than detail what we have accomplished in 2016 let us look at a bit of what we are planning for the new year. Never underestimate the power of momentum. The photo yearbook in this issue will give you a fun look at 2016.

As we continue work on organizing, taking inventory, and managing our archives we are looking to expand our office space into the adjacent apartment that normally houses our summer intern. The room will become a research and reading room for those who utilize our archives for their work. That necessitates finding housing for our intern elsewhere, with associated costs. We are also launching, as you read this, our new website which is much more user friendly, visual, useful, and elegant. All the properties, owned by HSFF or on the Register of Resources Worthy of Preservation, are prominently placed on the site with photos, in-depth descriptions and information. We will be adding a map to the site that locates all the properties for a good tour, or tours, given the growing number of Registered Properties. All eZines since we started publishing, all Newsletters of the past two and a half years, are shown on the site by their cover, with a click through to a download of the specific publication. We continue and expand our Salon El Zaguán lecture series monthly in 2017 and have scheduled our monthly art and history exhibitions for the coming year. We will continue our outreach and partnering with entities and organizations in the area of like mind and mission – OSFA, Santa Fe HPD, New Mexico HPD under the guidance of Jeff Pappas, the NPS National Trails Intermountain Region and Cultural Resources Specialist Mike Taylor, businesses and property owners. This last group, owners of historic homes and buildings, leads us to announce the expansion of our Stewards Group; a special membership at the Foundation that has access to four special events within a twelve month period. Tour, cocktails and food, and a short lecture within a special historic private home or building, significant for its history, architecture, builder, owner, or in some cases, all of the above. This is a small group of folks deeply interested in the history of our area, and the role individuals have played in making that history.
